Immigration

YResidential Status



After your arrival in Okayama and confirming your address, you must go to the City Hall within 14 days to notify authorities of your place of residence. Your Residence Card and your passport are required for the procedure.



If your arrival is at a smaller airport such as Okayama airport, your Residence Card will not be issued there. In this case you only need your passport.



For those who have received your Residence Card at the port of entry, bring it to the City Hall.



For those whose passports indicate that a Residence Card will be issued at a later date, the card will be mailed to the registered address within about two weeks after the registration at the City Hall.



Your period of stay is indicated on your Residence Card. If you wish to continue to reside in Japan, you can apply for an extension of your period of stay from 3 months before the end of your period of stay. Please get the application documents from the International Education and Student Mobility Division.



Staying in Japan beyond your period of stay is illegal and may result in being deported.



It takes 3-4 days for the International Education and Student Mobility Division to process your application for an official seal. After that, you will need to submit your application documents to the Immigration Office on your own, so please make sure to give yourself enough time to prepare the necessary documents.





Okayama University will not notify you, so please check your period of stay and remember when you need to complete the procedures.



If you change your address, notify the City Hall authorities within 14 days from the date of the change.



Lost Residence Card

If you lose your Residence Card, contact the Immigration Office immediately and apply for reissuance.



You must carry your Residence Card with you at all times during your stay in Japan.

Re-apply



You will be required to re-apply for a student visa if you are away for more than one year or your period of stay expires while away from Japan.

Extra-Status Activities



For an international student to have a part-time job, you need permission from the Immigration Office.



The application form is available at the International Education and Student Mobility Division or you can download it from the Immigration Office's website. You must fill it in and take it to the Immigration Office Okayama Branch.

For example, there are no classes during the first week of April, however, it is not spring vacation, so the working hour limit is 28 hours per week.

If you work part-time, please register your part-time work information and report the number of hours you work in Okayama University Residence Registration System.



You should not work when you are taking leave of absence from the university.

Precautions Regarding Part-time Jobs

Some bad employers do not pay wages for part-time work or only pay illegally low wages. If you face these problems, please talk to someone. You may use the Consultation Service for Foreign Workers offered by the Okayama Labor Office.



There are illegal places for international students to work;

- \cdot Dark bars, pubs, clubs, and other places that have little lighting darker than 10 ${\rm lux}$
- Pachinko, mahjong or other gambling parlors
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ All sex-related industries such as host/hostess clubs, bars, and internet and telephone-based clubs

These are illegal jobs even if you have obtained the Permission to Engage in Activity Other Than That Permitted Under the Status of Residence Previously Granted. You may be immediately deported if found.

Leave of Absence



If you are away from your studies for more than 3 months, such as on a leave of absence, you will be subject to revocation of your status of residence if you stay in Japan under the status of "Student". In the worst case, you may be deported.



Universities and schools are obliged to report the attendance of their international students to the Immigration Office, and Okayama University has been reporting students with long term absence.



Please note that you must obtain a new "Certificate of Eligibility (CESR)" to return to school.

Please contact your faculty at least 3 months prior to returning to Japan.

Airport

As a general rule, neither "Special re-entry permission" or "Re-entry permission" will be granted. Please return your Residence Card at the immigration check at the port of departure.



You may be permitted to stay if you have a justifiable reason, such as long-term hospitalization due to sickness. Please be sure to consult the Immigration Office in advance.



TAfter Graduation



The period of stay is generally set 2-3 months longer than the scheduled graduation period, however, even if the period of stay is still valid, you are not permitted to remain in Japan with your present residence status after graduation. Your status as a "Student" is for your studies, and this will expire once you graduate.



If you get a job in Japan and remain in Japan, please change your status of residence.



If you continue to find employment in Japan, you need to change your resident status to "Designated Activities".

A recommendation letter from the university is necessary for the procedure.



If you plan to continue job hunting in Japan after graduation, please apply for a letter of recommendation before graduation. In doing so, a proof of your job hunting activities so far will be required. If the previous job hunting is not sufficient, we cannot issue the letter of recommendation.

Also, please note that you will not be able to issue a letter of recommendation after graduation.



Check the contents from Residential Status (p3) to After Graduation (p7) on the website of the International Education and Student Mobility Division.

Safety

🕈 Leading a Safe Life



Japan has earthquakes and storm/flood disasters. The "Disaster Prevention Guidebook for Foreign Residents" from the City Hall contains important and useful information on how to stay safe in your daily life.

Please read it carefully and check what you should do in case of storms, floods and earthquakes.

Fire, serious illness, or injury



Be careful when cooking: carelessness can cause a fire



An international student left the room with a pot on a fire. The pot got burnt, causing the smoke alarm to go off, and caused a great commotion with the fire engine, the neighbors, and the university staff gathering at the apartment.



Another fire alert went off at the international dormitory when a student left a stove with a pan toasting bread. The burnt bread caused black smoke to start the fire alarm. The whole dormitory panicked and had to evacuate from the building.

Luckily, both cases did not develop into a serious fire, but they could have easily become one. Please be cautious and stay by the stove when using fire.

Drugs

It is strictly prohibited to carry, use, buy and sell drugs in Japan. You will be arrested if found with drugs under your possession.

Accidents caused by drinking

The legal drinking age in Japan is over 20 years old. Encouraging minors to drink is also illegal. You should drink appropriately and moderately. You should not do "Ikki" - "bottoms up" nor force it on others. If a person becomes ill after drinking too much, call an ambulance immediately and take proper care.



Suspicious Persons

Although Japan is a relatively safe country, avoid walking alone at night, and take a brightly lit and safe route. Make sure to lock the doors and windows of your residence.





Religious Cults

Several religious cults are trying to involve international students. Usually, they pretend to invite you to a club or circle, or a free event. Please be alert.

Bank Transfer Scams

_ _ _ _

Recently, bank transfer scam has greatly increased. There have been cases of exchange students receiving strange emails on their mobile phones demanding payment for false claims. If you happen to receive such suspicious emails, please ignore them.



Protection of your own individual information

Do not disclose your personal details such as your name, address, mobile phone number, and email address to strangers. There has been a case where international students shared their contact number to a friendly woman who invited them to a speech contest with prizes or parties with free food. These cases may develop into huge problems such as stalking, scam and religious cult activities, so please be cautious of these risks when meeting a stranger.

Bicycle Laws in Japan







Do not pick up old bicycles or use bicycles given by your friend. These bicycles may be stolen ones that may cause trouble. Buy your bicycle at a bicycle shop and remember to register your ownership under your name.

*****Bicycle Liability Insurance



People who use bicycles are required to purchase liability insurance to compensate for damages in the event of an accident involving a bicycle. It is required by the Okayama City Ordinance.

The Liability Insurance for Student Pursuing Education and Research that you are enrolled in the university does not cover accidents that occur in your daily life, such as when you go to your part-time job or your friend's place. Please make sure to purchase insurance to cover damages caused by accidents in your daily life, such as insurance from the University Co-op.



Liability insurance is an insurance policy that covers damages incurred by accidentally injuring another person or damaging another person's property in daily life, including compensation for damages.



The Liability Insurance for Student Pursuing Education and Research



Driver's License



To drive a car in Japan, you must take the same driving test that is available to Japanese people or convert your home country's Driving License to an International Driving License or a Japanese Driving License. If you wish to own a car, you must purchase Mandatory Vehicle Liability Insurance and additionaly, secondary car insurance.



Vehicle Liability Insurance

Everyone who owns a vehicle must purchase the Vehicle Liability Insurance by law. The insurance covers for injuries or death caused by a car. However, insurance does not cover the cost for damages caused to your or someone else's property. This is why secondary car insurance is required.

Y Secondary Insurance



This optional secondary car insurance covers for cost or property damage that is not covered in the Vehicle Liability Insurance. The insurance fee depends on the insurance company, terms of compensation, the limit of monetary compensation, age, and so on. Purchasing secondary car insurance is not mandatory, however, as a car owner please purchase one for your safety.

Health Care

Illness and Injury



Okayama University Health Service Center provides health care services for students and staff free of charge. It is open during the day on weekdays.

Consult in advance



There are troubles of dental treatment reported in the clinics around the university. If you need to visit a dentist, dermatologist, or an eye specialist, please visit Health Service Center beforehand to find which clinics are reliable.



During nighttime and holidays, if you are seriously ill or injured call 119 for an ambulance.

The Health Service Center provides checkups twice a year in April and October. You are required to take the check-up once a year.

Infectious Disease



If you have a sudden fever, go to the Health Service Center, a clinic, or hospital immediately.

The period of suspension will be determined by the university based on the "Certificate of recovery" issued by the doctor, so please consult with your faculty's academic office.



If you have an infectious disease such as Coronavirus disease, influenza, or measles, your attendance will be suspended until the doctor determines that you have recovered. Please do not attend classes. Classes that you are unable to attend during that period will be treated as official absences upon notification.



National Health Insurance



All international students, who will live in Japan for more than 3 months, must apply for the National Health Insurance. The medical fees may be expensive, but if you are enrolled in the insurance, you would only have to pay for 30% of your fees at the hospital for your illness or injury.



The application should be submitted to the City Hall when you register your place of residence. Your insurance fee may be reduced by reporting your income.

Accident Insurance



Please apply for 2 kinds of accident Insurances, "Personal Accident Insurance for Student Pursuing Education and Research" for any injuries to yourself, and "Liability Insurance for Student Pursuing Education and Research" for any injuries or damages you caused for others or their property. Most faculties require you to purchase both insurances. Inquire with your faculty's academic office or your supervisor for details.

Student Life Storm Warning

If a storm warning is announced, all classes from that point will be cancelled. If the warning is announced between 6:00 am to 8:40 am, all classes for the day will be cancelled.

Even if the storm warning is called off by 8:40, classes will still be cancelled.

é Bank

When opening a bank account, bring a fluent Japanese speaker with you. Prepare necessary documents and follow the procedures at the counter. The necessary documents differ from banks, but it is recommended to bring the following.

Daily Life



If you have opened your account, please be aware of the following.





If you have extended your residence period or changed your address, you need to go to the bank counter and notify them of the changes. If you do not follow the procedures, your transaction may be limited. Enter your bank book at least once a month. If you do not enter your bank book for more than 30 transactions, these transactions will not be printed on your bank book and might cause trouble when applying for extension of period of stay.

When departing from Japan, the owner of the account must close the account. If you leave your account and leave, you might not be able to draw money, use or even cancel the same account, moreover you might not be able to create a new account at the same bank, when you return to Japan.



Banks get crowded in April and October. If it is not urgent, we advise going after a period of time.

†Housing



In Japan, if you want to rent an apartment, the university Coop or neighborhood real estate agency will introduce you to the properties.



In most cases, a guarantor is required to rent an apartment. Okayama University cannot become a guarantor. Please use a guarantor service provided by private companies.

Okayama University recommends Global Trust Networks (GTN) as a guarantor company and introduces GTN to neighborhood agencies. GTN is a guarantor company exclusively for the international community, and they not only provide multi-language trouble assistance, but they also assist in the apartment search. Please check their website for more details.



Garbage Disposal

Please be sure to know the rules for your area. The following are the garbage rules in Okayama City



In Japan, garbage is categorized into five different types.

Burnable trash ② Non-burnable trash ③ Plastic resources
 Recyclable trash ⑤ Large-size garbage





Designated by Okayama City

Transparent plastic bag

To dispose of Burnable and Non-burnable garbage, if you live off-campus, use the yellow plastic bag designated by the city. For those in the dormitory, use a transparent plastic bag. To dispose Plastic resources, regardless of where you live, use a transparent plastic bag.



Each type has its own collection date. If you live off-campus, check the trash disposal days from your neighbors or apartment owner. For dormitory residents, refer to The Rules and Regulations handout, or ask the manager.

T Social Security and Tax Number System

You will receive the number to your registered address.

Municipalities will issue a single 12-digit Individual Number named "My Number" to each and every person who holds a resident record in their city. The Number is used for administrative procedures related to social security, taxation, and disaster response.

You cannot use this notification letter to prove your My Number or as an identity card. If you need to prove your My Number in cases such as creating a bank account or taking a part-time job, please acquire your Certificate of Residence with your My Number on it, or request your My Number Card.



Japanese National Pension

Enroll in the National Pension Plan

All people that reside in Japan and are 20 years of age or older, including international students, are required to enroll in the National Pension Plan.

International students under 20 years of age at the time of arrival in Japan are also required to join it upon turning 20 years old.

Once enrolled in the National Pension Plan, you will receive a basic pension number notification and a National Pension Insurance premium payment slip about one month later.





You can apply for exemption of the pension plan when you complete the enrollment procedure. The exemption needs to be made every year. You need to show your Student ID.

Non degree seeking students : **Contribution Payment Exemption System**

You may be exempt from contribution payments if the previous year's income of you/your spouse is low. You will be exempt after the application is approved.
