



- Canada's first Nobel Prize in Physics, awarded to alumnus Richard Taylor in 1990.
- 2 The Canadian Maple Leaf flag, designed by alumnus George Stanley!
- Canadian leadership alumnus Joe Clark is a former Prime Minister of Canada and was the youngest person ever to take on this role.
- Great video games such as *Bejeweled* and *Plants* vs *Zombies*! PopCap Games was co-founded by UAlberta alumnus Jason Kapalka.
- Discovering an asteroid and naming it after UAlberta! Alumnus Andrew Lowe named the asteroid he discovered "UofAlberta" it's located between Mars and Jupiter.
- The invention of early sonar in 1917 by faculty member Dr. Richard Boyle.
- Canada's first successful open-heart surgery, performed in 1956 by faculty member Dr. John Callaghan.

Ken has been in the creative/tech industry for over 10 years, co-founding several interactive companies, most recently Rocketfuel Games, an educational games studio, and co-founded community initiatives like TEDxEdmonton and artsScene Edmonton.

with different incubators in the city that would offer some space and some coaching, which were really valuable for me because I didn't know anything, really, so I wanted to learn from everyone around me. But you had to step out and start doing that in those environments. I think the thing that was missing there was the community piece. And I think with the second company, Rocketfuel Games, especially since we were working with companies a lot outside of Edmonton, and people thought we were working from Vancouver or Toronto because we were developing educational kids software and we spent a lot of time on the road. Then coming back to Edmonton we thought, "is there anything going on here, why create this thing here." And that's where the first Startup Edmonton stuff started to form was because we could either take off, which would be the easy thing to do, or we could try to make something happen here.

In Edmonton, because it is smaller (or a small big city), we have a chance to make noise, and raise the bar for what we're doing. I think that has been the difference, especially over the last three to five years - there has been a new wave of leaders coming out and building companies, starting stuff, doing things. When you start to get that mass, then the rest of the community starts to notice, and in bigger cities that doesn't tend to happen."

To start the application process, you need to complete and submit the Application for Undergraduate Studies form. The application deadline for most direct entry programs is March 1. Some document(s) will be required with your application or by March 15 - please refer to the website to see which deadline applies to you. If you are a high school applicant, August 1 is the document deadline for the final results of your current year and all other required documents (June 15 if you are a transfer applicant). You should try to send your interim documents as soon as possible to get an admissions decision sooner.

Most undergraduate programs can be entered directly from high school, but some require at least one year of pre-professional study before you can apply. You can take all of your pre-professional courses at UAlberta.

The Bridging Program (BP) is for excellent students who meet all of UAlberta's academic criteria but still need to improve their English skills in order to enter a degree program.

Students can take English language courses at UAlberta and earn academic credit at the same time. After you complete the BP successfully, you can continue as a full-time undergraduate student.

4. SUBMIT ANY REMAINING DOCUMENTS FOR ADMISSION CONSIDERATION.

Your application will be evaluated for Admission after we receive the necessary documents as described on your BearTracks account. These can be submitted at the time of your application (see Step 2 above) or as follows:

In order to study in Canada, you will need a study permit. Application processing time can take up to three months or more. We encourage you to apply for your study permit well in advance of your program start date.


