The 19<sup>th</sup> ASEAN and 9<sup>th</sup> ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum 23<sup>rd</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024
Hosted by Universiti Brunei Darussalam

### 1. About the Forum

The ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum is an integral part of the ASEAN University Network's (AUN) youth-focused initiatives. Its main purpose is to encapsulate the essence of ASEAN's cultural heritage, its influences, and its evolution in order to foster greater understanding and appreciation of the concept of 'ASEANness.' This forum serves as a vibrant platform for celebrating the diversity and commonalities within the ASEAN+3 region through meaningful dialogues centered around artistic and cultural experiences.

The inaugural edition of the ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum was held in 2003, hosted by De La Salle University in the Philippines. Since then, it has been organized annually, with AUN member universities taking turns to serve as hosts. In 2007, in alignment with the ASEAN+3 Higher Education Policy Dialogue, it was decided to establish the ASEAN+3 University Network and enhance student mobility by expanding various ongoing activities, including the AUN Educational Forum, the Young Speakers Contest, and the ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum. As a result, the ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum successfully evolved into the ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum.

The transformation commenced in the "11th ASEAN and 1st ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum" held at Universiti Malaya, Malaysia, which marked the first occasion when delegates from China, Japan, and Korea were invited to participate.

### 2. Theme

Futuring together towards preserving arts and culture (Mendepan bersama ke arah kelestarian seni dan budaya)

"Futuring Together towards Preserving Art and Culture" suggests a collaborative and forward-thinking approach to ensure the protection and continuity of artistic and cultural elements. The term "Futuring Together" implies a shared effort to shape a

future where these aspects are not only conserved but also actively nurtured and adapted for ongoing relevance. The phrase underscores the idea that preservation involves not just looking backward but actively engaging in a collective effort to shape a future where art and culture play a vital role in the fabric of society. It reflects a commitment to safeguarding and promoting the richness of human creativity and heritage for generations to come."

### 3. Forum Objectives:

- To feature and disseminating the rich tapestry of cultures within ASEAN+3, primarily through music, dance, and other forms of performing arts that serve as expressions of their national heritage and identity.
- To cultivate an understanding of the cultural bonds that unite member nations, highlighting the intrinsic value of the ASEAN Community.
- To expose participating students to the wealth of cultural diversity and commonalities to foster mutual comprehension, camaraderie, and cooperation among the youth in advancing awareness of ASEAN+3.
- To provide platforms for dialogue and exchange among participating students, cultural officers, and directors, facilitating discussions on cultural and artistic issues in their respective countries, presenting solutions to these challenges, and fostering commitments to building a regional identity while contributing to the preservation and enrichment of the cultures of participating countries.

### 4. Expected Outcomes:

The programme's carefully crafted activities, interactions, and experiences aim to help students attain the following objectives:

- a) Enhanced awareness of ASEAN and a deeper understanding of its identity.
- b) Acquired knowledge of various cultures, languages, and religions, coupled with heightened sensitivity to their diversity.
- c) Proficiency in cross-cultural communication.
- d) Strengthened leadership skills.
- e) Establishment of fresh collaborative relationships and expanded networking opportunities.
