2025 Application Guidelines for Exchange Program Okayama (EPOK)

Purpose of the EPOK program

The exchange program Okayama (EPOK) (hereinafter referred to as "the EPOK program") is a short-term study abroad program (comprising the acceptance and dispatch of students) provided by Okayama University (hereinafter referred to as "the University"). To implement the program, the University has concluded detailed operational rules about interuniversity exchanges, such as those concerning exemption from tuition fees, with 60 universities in 22 countries and regions. To promote student exchanges between these overseas universities (hereinafter referred to as "the EPOK partner universities") so as to improve individual universities' research and education levels, and help enhance mutual understanding and friendly, amicable relations with these countries, the University accepts applications for study abroad under the EPOK program.

Details

1. Eligibility

Students who are enrolled in a regular course of the University and satisfy all the following requirements are eligible to apply for the EPOK program:

- (1) Students who are excellent in both academic achievements and personality
- (2) Students who have a definite purpose and plan of study abroad and are expected to accomplish favorable results through study abroad at the EPOK partner universities
- (3) Students who intend to continue studying at the University after completing their study abroad at the EPOK partner universities
- (4) Students who satisfy the admission requirements specified by an individual EPOK partner university or other criteria equivalent to such admission requirements (For details, refer to the attached "List of EPOK partner universities, duration of study abroad and requirements, etc.")
- (5) Students whose grade point average (GPA) score is 2.0 or higher at the time of submission of their application form
 - (GPA evaluation standards and calculation methods differ between Okayama University and overseas universities. Therefore, even if the GPA value on your transcript at Okayama University meets the designated standard of each partner university, your GPA will be recalculated according to the evaluation standards of the partner university, and you may not be accepted.)
- (6) Students who have been enrolled in Okayama university for at least one year at the time of starting their study abroad program.
 - (For first-year students, those who have completed up to the fourth semester at the start of their study abroad program.)
- (7) Students who meet any of the following language proficiency requirements at the time of submission of their application form

	2	Individual counselling	After registering for instruction in study abroad under the EPOK program, you will receive an email from the EPOK study abroad advisor. Please arrange a schedule with him or her and have an individual counselling. Complete the individual counselling at least two weeks prior to the application submission deadline. *Make a study plan that includes your university choices and the time of study abroad before the consultation. Make your plan after carefully checking whether studying abroad will affect your moving up to the next year or your graduation, and whether there are any compulsory courses at the university during your studying abroad period.

3. Period of dispatch (study abroad), host universities and number of students

[Start of Study Abroad] (Spring Semester) January ~ March, 2025

(Fall Semester) July ~ October, 2025

[Period of dispatch (study abroad)] More than one trimester or one semester but within one year

**For spring semester study abroad, some partner institutions may have restrictions on study permission

For details of the duration of study abroad at the EPOK partner universities, refer to the attached "List of EPOK partner universities, duration of study abroad and requirements, etc."

[Host universities] See the attached "List of EPOK partner universities, duration of study abroad and requirements, etc.

*Depending on the circumstances of the host university and other factors, it is not necessarily possible for you to study at the university of your choice.

[Number of students] Depends on the time of dispatch. For details, please ask EPOK study abroad advisors.

4. Expenses

Students will be exempted from official examination fees, admission fees, and tuition fees of the EPOK partner universities. However, a student whose foreign language proficiency (TOEFL-iBT® or IELTS score) does not meet the prescribed requirements set by the EPOK partner university may be required to take language courses at a designated language school for a certain period of time as a prerequisite for acceptance. In such a case, the tuition fees at the language school may be borne by the student.

Students will cover the student visa application fee, travel expenses, and dormitory fees. Students will pay the tuition fee to the University during the period of study abroad as usual.

5. Scholarships

Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) Overseas Study Abroad Support System (agreement-based dispatch of students)

If you will be studying at an EPOK partner institution, you may apply for a scholarship (60,000-100,000 yen/month, depending on the destination area) under the "Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) Overseas Study Support Program (Dispatch by Agreement)". If you wish to apply, please carefully read and understand the following, then check "Yes" box in the "JASSO Scholarship" column of the EPOK Application Form. (There are no separate documents to be submitted at the time of application).

Students who can understand and fulfill the following will be recommended to the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) as recipients of the scholarship

This scholarship aims to support the partial expenses of studying abroad to cultivate individuals who can contribute to the global society and enhance the internationalization and competitiveness of our country's universities. Under this principle, Okayama University pledges to return the study achievements of dispatched students to the local community as added value and has acquired this scholarship. Recipients of this scholarship are required to actively participate in activities promoting study abroad.

Furthermore, only applicants who have Japanese nationality or permanent resident status and a grade evaluation coefficient of 2.30 (out of 3.00) in the previous academic year are eligible to apply. For details on the evaluation coefficient, please refer to the following.

Since the amount of the scholarship allocated to the University is fixed, not all applicants may receive the scholarship. After screening, etc., as necessary, the scholarship recipients will be notified in May for fall study abroad programs and in October for spring study abroad programs. Applicants must be Japanese citizens or permanent residents of Japan.

7. Student status during the period of dispatch

The period of dispatch, approved by the dean of the faculty or the graduate school of the student concerned, is considered as the duration of "study abroad" in accordance with the university regulations or the graduate school regulations of the University, and is included in the period of attendance at the University.

8. Credits earned from class subjects at the EPOK partner universities

Pursuant to the provisions set forth by each faculty and graduate school, credits earned from class subjects at the EPOK partner universities may be deemed as credits acquired by completing class subjects at the University, to an extent not exceeding 60 credits. Because approval of credits earned varies by faculty/graduate school, be sure to confirm the details in advance.

Subjects that can be taken at the EPOK partner universities are specified on the official websites of the individual EPOK partner universities; confirm the details in advance.

9. Credit for "Study Abroad II"

EPOK students will receive credit for "Study Abroad II" after completing the program.(Only for undergraduate students)

Registration is not required.

10. Registration and auditing of class subjects in the EPOK program

As an opportunity to have prior hands-on experience of study abroad, those who have been selected as a student to be dispatched under the EPOK program are advised to take or audit class subjects (liberal arts class subjects conducted in English only) intended for EPOK international students as much as possible. The classes are held in English.

11. Purchase of overseas travel insurance

As a necessary preparation for study abroad, students are required to subscribe to the overseas travel insurance designated by the University. You may also be required to purchase insurance as specified by the EPOK partner university.

12. Safety Control and Caution

Due to unexpected natural disasters, international situations, or pandemics, the student exchange program may be suspended or altered. The students at the host universities should be urged to return to Japan. Note that all the expenses at the host university and in the return travel are fundamentally the student's responsibility.

The University determines safety and viability of the exchange program based on the Safety Hazard for Oversea Travel released by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan.
